
## Pyrenula chlorospila





Identification: The thallus is light tan to olive green with tiny white flecks resembling small cracks in wax. It frequently forms mosaics separated by a black prothallus. Perithecia (fruiting bodies) are dark and rounded, up to 0.3 mm across and are only slightly raised above the thallus.

Chemistry: K+ yellow, Pd+/- yellowish, UV+/-white.

**Similar species:** The small, crowded perithecia are distinctive.

**Habitat:** Common on smooth barked deciduous trees in shaded woodland, often in mosaics with *Pyrenula macrospora*.

**Distribution:** To the south and west of Britain and Ireland.
